

What is a Faith Community Nurse?

Faith Community Nurses (FCNs) are licensed, registered professional nurses (RN) who practice patient-centered care, combining their nursing knowledge and spiritual care. They advocate for the needs of self, congregants, and the community at large, empowering them to be in control, while assisting in finding health and wholeness. FCNs do not provide hands-on care. However, through their roles as health educators and counselors, promote health and ways to prevent and/or minimize illness.

FCN ministry efforts may be salaried or on a volunteer status. Nevertheless, the RN who accepts the call is caring, compassionate and a servant-leader with a strong sense of faith and hope. In return, they receive "...the most rewarding job that God has given me. I feel... like I'm fulfilling my purpose, and the reason I became a nurse."

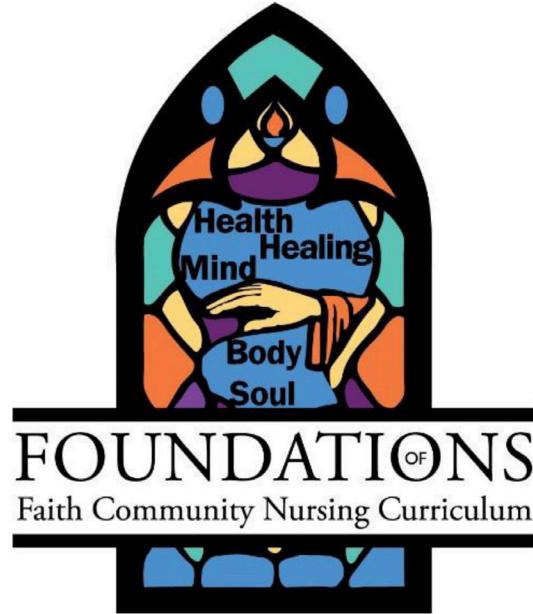
Faith Community Nursing imparts close attention to an individual's spirit, where praying and addressing spiritual needs are supported. Individuals or groups come to the ministry at times feeling hopeless and helpless. The FCN must be able to inspire hope and encourage faith which, in turn, changes their outlook and possibly health outcomes, maintaining and/or regaining wholeness in body, mind, and spirit.

This specialty practice is regulated by the Faith Community Nurse Scope and Standards of Practice (3rd edition), your state's Nurse Practice Act, as well as Nursing's "Code of Ethics with Interpretive Statements".

Course Overview

This **Foundations of Faith Community Nursing** course, developed through the Westberg Institute for Faith Community Nursing in consultation with the National League of Nursing (NLN) and the American Nurses Association Credentialing Center (ANACC), explores this specialty practice which combines professional nursing with health ministry.

Developed from the Judeo-Christian perspective, this 2019 curriculum is respectful of, and can be applied to, other faith traditions by exploring their differences and similarities.

In the context of a faith tradition, areas of discovery include:

- Practice History and Philosophy
- Ethical Issues
- Whole Person Health/Healing
- Loss, Suffering & Grief

Participant will utilize the nursing process as it applies to the leadership role of an FCN, preparing them to initiate and maintain this health ministry within, and to, the larger surrounding community.
